## How did you hear about the IRC?

About four years ago a childhood friend of mine did some work with the IRC in West Africa, finding girls who had been kidnapped by rebels and reuniting them with their estranged families. I was in complete awe and wanted to get involved.


You recently visited an IRC settlement in Thailand. What struck you most about it? The camp I visited, Tham Hin, was set up for refugees who have fled Burma for their safety. I was really impressed with the camp's infrastructure and how smoothly

everything ran, like the health education program. There's a real commitment to quality of life there.

## IRC has also helped bring refugees to the States. Have you met any of these folks?

Yes! In San Diego I met families that used to live in Tham Hin. The IRC has an urban garden in the city where people from all parts of Asia and Africa plant food from their homelands—like lemongrass or cassava—and sell it at a local farmers market.

And how were they doing? Pretty well, I think! The food was selling fast. And I know it sounds a bit hokey, but seeing these people from all over the world being able to negotiate and work together made me really happy. —Sandy M. Fernández
